
THE YEAR IN REVIEW


In FY 2018, ACCEL Educational Services served 389 K-12 students with severe autism and multiple disabilities on behalf of 41 Maricopa and northern Pinal County school districts unable to serve them in district programs due to the severity of their disabilities. 21 of these students attended ACCEL school programs on scholarships. Students attend ACCEL's school program at no cost to their parents, 53% are minority students and approximately 70% meet the income criteria for free or reduced school meals.


ACCEL Adult Services served 95 adults with a wide range of disabilities. 97% of the adults were served at no cost to them or their families and receive Title XIX benefits for adults with low income.


ACCEL's BISTÀ Center clinical programs served approximately 40 families. Services included early intervention services for children with autism and other disabilities beginning at 18 months of age, classroom school readiness programs for 4 and 5 year olds preparing for successful entry into public school kindergarten and intensive services for K-8 students attending public school education programs. BISTA Center also provided parent training to help parents follow through with programming and work cooperatively with their child's public school.
